47	Suigan Sōmin	Hanging scroll (<i>ichigyō</i>) reading <i>Nanboku Tōzai Katsuro Tsūzu</i> (Zen Saying, literally meaning 'South, North, East, West, the Path to Live by Continues')	
48	Hon'ami Kōetsu	Black Raku tea bowl named Murakumo (Village Cloud)
